We ask all parents to assist us by participating in our Hobby-Craft Show as follows:

Encourage your youth to enter as many articles as possible from the Class List given to them by their leaders. Please read closely the General Rules included with the Class List, particularly noting rule 18. *"No entries are to be removed from the display area until after presentations are made under penalty of disqualification. All entries are to be picked up on Saturday afternoon at 3:00 pm after presentation of awards by showing tear-off portion of entry tag. All entries not picked up will be disposed of unless Section Scouters claim those entries."* If you cannot be there, we suggest that you make arrangements with another parent or your child's leader to pick up your entries.

Please Note: All entries must be given to a Section Scouter before Friday evening, April 4. No entries will be accepted on Saturday (for exceptions see the General Rules).

To Parents of Beavers: Beavers are allowed to enter the Hobby-Craft Show but do not compete for trophies or awards. Most Beaver Colonies enter a group entry. Beaver Group entries will be displayed in a separate section and each participant will receive a ribbon. We are inviting the White Tail Beavers to submit one entry, a craft they have made at Beavers. These entries will also be displayed in a separate section.

Admission Charge to the Hobby-Craft Show: Admission to the Show will be \$1.00 per adult and \$0.50 per child. However, anyone wearing a Scouting or Guiding uniform will be admitted free of charge.

Crafts and hobbies are a very important part of the Scouting program. This Show will give participants an opportunity to display their skills and interests to other participants, parents and the community. Skills in crafts and hobbies, developed through Scouting programs, often lead to lifetime interests and vocations that would otherwise not have been discovered.
